# Filling in the Standard Information Form (form 1)

The standard information form asks questions about the heritage of your church building. It is a legal document and is required for each Faculty application.

The Online Faculty System was built to assist you when filling out this form. All the heritage information required for the standard information form is held and managed centrally in the <u>Church Heritage Record</u>. If you find any errors with the information of your church, please contact the Cathedral and Church Building's Division of the Archbishops' Council (aka <u>ChurchCare</u>).



This will automatically fill in the standard information form with the data that is held in the Church Heritage Record. *\*It will overwrite any information you have already entered manually*.


3. Click ok

Some of the questions can be a bit tricky. If you are not certain what is being asked, take your mouse and hover over the little question mark sign – secrets could be revealed.




